PROGRAMMING

- Indoor Events Staff are currently working with roughly 20 groups/organizations on logistics for upcoming indoor events
- Outdoor Events Staff are currently working through 31 Outdoor Special Event Applications for the upcoming spring/summer season
- Canada Day parade float registration opened beginning of May
- Registration continues for summer programming for day camps and swim lessons
- Sport leagues and tournaments at the Agriplex are complete for the 2023-24 indoor season
- Senior Lakeside Active Adults Association continues to expand with over 700 members. The association is currently shifting their focus to their summer programming schedule

FACILITIES

- The Splash Pad at Anne Hathaway Park was opened on May 18th. The hours of operation for the Splash Pad and adjacent public washrooms are daily from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm.
- The Stratford and Area Lions Club has donated towards the full cost of a storage shed for Lions Pool. The storage shed will be utilized to store pool equipment and materials, so that these items are not stored in the pool filtration and mechanical areas.
- The Lions Pool was opened on Friday, June 7th.
- The City of Stratford's Market Square Music hosted at City Hall Market Square is returning, started on May 24th. This event will run on Fridays from May 24th to June 28th from 6:30 to 7:30 pm.
- The Ontario Pork Congress event was held at the Rotary Complex and Agriplex facilities on June 19th & 20th.
- An increase in ice rental usage has been apparent in Q1 of 2024. The implementation of the new Last Minute Ice program is a large factor in the increase. With the Last Minute Ice program, users are able to reserve available ice rentals outside of regular office hours.

FACILITIES CAPITAL

- The replacement of the flat roofing system at the William Allman Memorial Arena was awarded to Grand Valley Roofing & Coatings Inc., in the amount of \$397,041.32. The replacement of the barrel roofing system at the William Allman Memorial Arena was awarded to John Kenyon Limited in the amount of \$1,251,371.04.
- The replacement of the roofing system at National Stadium project has been completed.
- The replacement of the windows at the Municipal Golf Course Clubhouse capital project has been completed.
- The replacement of the Rooftop HVAC Unit at City Hall Annex capital project has been completed.
- The replacement of the roofing system at the Administration of Justice Building was awarded to Proteck Roofing & Sheet Metal Inc., in the amount of \$531,350.86.
- The supply of new LED lighting fixtures to retrofit corporate facilities (City Hall, Public Library, 47 Downie, Dufferin Lions Arena ice surface lighting) was awarded to City Electric Supply, in the amount of \$84,148.19.
- The installation of the new LED lighting fixtures was awarded to BKS Electric Technical Services, in the amount of \$78,535.
