4. Report of the Manager of Children's Services

4.1 Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Implementation Update and Directed Growth Priorities (SOC25-007)

Staff Recommendation: THAT the report titled, "Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Implementation Update and Directed Growth Priorities" (SOC25-007), be received for information.

Sub-committee Discussion: The Director of Social Services welcomed the new Manager of Children's Services who provided an overview of the report highlighting the following:

- the report outlining updates to implementation of the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care System (CWELCC);
- the 2025 maximum daily parent fee for eligible children under 6 years old reduced to \$22;
- the Provincial introduction of a new cost based funding formula, representing a shift in funding of licensed childcare with new accountability for Childcare Operators and Service System Managers;
- on March 31, 2025, the Province having communicated recalibrated growth targets for spaces to be enrolled into CWELCC;
- Stratford saw the reduction of 108 spaces and associated reduction of start up and operational funding;
- growth targets identifying 461 spaces to be added by the end of 2026;
- there having been an announcement of Early Learning and Childcare (ELCC) Infrastructure Fund for Service System Managers,

with this being the first major community based capital funding made available since CWELCC implementation;

- Stratford having received \$1.6 million through this funding;
- the funding being for centre based, community based, not for profit programs or programs directly operated by Service System Manager in areas or populations being underserved;
- CWELCC expansion to be in alignment with the Service System Manager directed growth plan;
- prioritization in accordance with current rates of access to licensed childcare; and
- all municipalities currently falling below the Provincial stated target of an overall access rate of 37% for children ages 0-5.

5. Report of the Supervisor of Homelessness and Housing Stability

5.1 Homelessness and Housing Stability Update (SOC25-006)

Staff Recommendation: THAT the report titled, "Homelessness and Housing Stability Update" (SOC25-006), be received for information.

Sub-committee Discussion: The Homelessness and Housing Stability Supervisor provided an overview of the report highlighting the following:

- The City of Stratford working collaboratively with community agencies towards the shared goal of ending homelessness;
- key positions having been created such as the Community Developer positions in St. Marys and North Perth, the Community Safety and Well Being By-law Officer position and the Community Paramedic Program in partnership with the Perth County Mobile Integrated Health Team; and

 implementation of Homeless Individuals and Family Information System (HIFIS) to better share information between agencies for individuals being served by multiple agencies and to streamline service delivery to prioritize individual needs.

6. Department Update

Sub-committee Discussion: The Director of Social Services provided an overview of the metrics reflected in the variance report for the first quarter (Q1) of 2025.

Discussion occurred between Sub-committee and staff. Highlights of the discussion included:

- a Member noting there were over 300 monthly maintenance requests and asked if these are new monthly requests;
- staff noting these are new monthly requests with the number being reflective of aging buildings, continued maintenance, routine clean up from winter and summer preparation;
- the work being done by three maintenance repair people and external contactor support;
- life safety work being done within 1 day, and then work prioritized by 3, 7 or 30 days;
- a work order being created by the maintenance team for each task required;
- a Member asked if statistics are shared amongst other, similarly sized, municipalities and staff noted Ontario Works (OW) statistics are accessible with regional and Provincial OW meetings held to identify trends; and
- at present, Perth County having fewer job openings with the economic state having a larger impact than in Grey, Bruce or Huron.
